Leash Law Reminder

The City is seeing an increase in complaints about loose dogs around town. There have been a number of complaints of dogs running after people while they are walking their dogs on leashes. You can get a ticket from the Sherriff's Office if the person your dog goes after chooses to call and file a report. These types of tickets can end up as being a Class B Misdemeanor and go on your record. We have also had many complaints of barking dogs day and night. This is very frustrating to those people who have to listen to the barking while trying to sleep. Please be aware of your dogs and do what you can to stop the barking. The City has contracted with BA Robinson Tree Service to trim the trees that have grown into the above ground power lines. They could get start-



ed with this project as soon as the first week of October. They will need access to your yards to be able to accomplish most of the tree trimming. Also, with the new maintenance contract signed with Dixie Power, their employees will be in and out of yards while mapping and creating GPS coordinates of the City's power lines. Dump Site Reminders

It has been a few months now since the large roll off dumpster was placed at the dump site. It seems that the dump site continues to be a mess. The large dumpsters purpose is to hold the bigger items that do not fit into the smaller dumpsters. When these bigger items are put in the small dumpsters they are not able to hold as much trash.

In an effort to control the safety and appearance of the dump site, we are asking that large and bulky items such as couches, furniture, mattresses, appliances, etc. be placed in the large roll off dumpster. If you have items such as these and would prefer to have them picked up, please notify Republic Services. They can be reached at (435) 628-2821 or (800) 438-5927. After calling, these items should be placed curbside. If you have any questions or concerns please contact the City Offices at (435) 878-2221.

We are again asking residents to please follow the posted dump site rules. Here is a reminder to familiarize yourself again. No oil, batteries, paint, or tires. Also, absolutely no commercial materials. Do not dump hot ashes or dead animals. Large objects should not protrude and all garbage should be contained. Limbs must be cut and bundled. If you have limbs, consider using the burn area which is for natural, unprocessed wood, branches, trees and limbs, weeds, and garden waste. These materials should be placed on the existing pile. Processed lumber including; all construction waste, cardboard, paper, tires, plastics, and other garbage are not allowed in the burn area. With the burn area being unlocked this summer we have noticed many items being placed there that shouldn't be. It is a privilege to have this service and if it is abused, the service will no longer be available. Please do your part by placing your trash in the appropriate place.





MEALS ON WHEELS



Meals on Wheels is a service provided to those who are **60 years** of age or older, unable to leave their home without assistance from someone else, and unable to drive. The Meals on Wheels program is available throughout Washington County and provides a nutritionally balanced meal & beverage (2% milk), following the dietary guidelines of the U. S. Department of Health and Human Services and the U. S. Department of Agriculture. Meals are delivered **Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday** between the hours of **11am – 1pm**. On two of the three days we deliver, you could choose to receive 2 meals, for a total of 5 meals per week. There is a suggested donation of \$3.00 per meal.
