## Park Update

The new City Park is coming right along. The highly anticipated splash pad is nearly complete. The concrete work for the pad was poured. The 2<sup>nd</sup> phase of the splash pad is the Control building, which will be a block building that stores the pumps, splash pad controls, and restrooms.

The Community building is in its final stages. The flooring and cabinets have been installed. The appliances have been ordered, and interior doors should be installed this week and the lighting fixtures will be installed soon.

The sports court is mostly complete. There are only a few minor things left and it will be finished.



The curbing is finished and the asphalt for the parking lots will be done mid-August. We are hoping to have the parking lots finished before the Cornfest. Volunteers will continue to work on the sidewalks and pathways and the City employees are finishing the underground utilities.

Also, resurfacing will be done on the Tennis courts near the end of August after the parking lots are finished.

Overall, it is coming along quite nicely! Thank you to everyone that has volunteered their time, talents, and money to help make this park possible! It will be enjoyed by so many once it is complete.
