Keeping Us Safe

With the start of the cold winter months upon us, I would like to take this time to remind you about fire danger.

Next to kitchen fires, heating sources are the second leading cause of home fire deaths. Half of all home heating fires occur in December, January, and February.

With this in mind, I would encourage you to take precautions when using heating sources such as electric blankets, space heaters, wood stoves, and fireplaces.

There are two simple yet commonly overlooked safety steps that can make a difference in case of a fire.

First, check your existing smoke alarms. Second, have an escape plan and practice it. These two things can save lives.

Planning for fire emergencies is important. Make sure all household members know two ways to escape from every room of your home and set up a meeting place outside your home in case of a fire. Practice escaping from your home at least twice a year and at different times of the day. Teach all household members to stop, drop, and roll if their clothing should catch on fire.

- Replace batteries in smoke alarms every six months.
- Replace smoke alarms every 10 years.

A small amount of prevention each year can go a long way and make a difference in your life as well as the life of a loved one.

Emergency Preparedness

As a City we would encourage you to become aware of possible emergencies and disasters which could happen within our community and have proper planning for your family and neighborhoods. Citizen preparation is encouraged by:

1. Acquiring and maintaining a disaster supply kit and other essential supplies.
2. Develop a family emergency plan including communication and review the plan periodically with your family.
3. Minimize potential damage to your home by securing water heaters, tall furniture, etc.
4. Serve as a disaster volunteer in your neighborhood.

In the upcoming months you will hear more about our City's disaster plan and how you as members of the community can help implement this plan. With the flooding that has happened in the past, there have been many volunteers but they are not always sure where to go. This plan will help direct willing volunteers to help where they are needed the most, instead of many at one scene when they might be needed elsewhere where conditions are more serious. The City is working with local church leaders who will also help implement this plan.

You will soon be given a packet from the City Office that will contain more information on this plan, how you can help, and instructions on flagging and what you will do with the flags your household will receive.

We will be looking for EOC (Emergency Operations Center) and VCC (Volunteer Coordination Center) volunteers to be trained to help when an emergency arises. Please contact the City Office if you are willing to help with these needs during an emergency.

We hope with organized help from the City and community volunteers, we can get help where it is needed most in a timely manner during an emergency.
