Dumpster Do's and Don'ts

Many of you have heard of the recent fires that were started from someone placing hot ashes in the dumpsters at the local dump site. This is a friendly reminder of what should and should not be placed in the dumpsters: **NO OIL, BATTERIES, PAINT, or TIRES.** Also, absolutely **NO COMMERCIAL MATERIALS.** Do not dump **HOT ASHES** or dead animals. Limbs must be cut and bundled. Large objects should not protrude and all garbage should be contained. As you can see from the picture, many people are not following instructions, and it is resulting in a massive mess of trash! Please do your part to help with this problem!

Also, immediately North of the Collection Station is the

Tree/Limb burn area. This area is for natural, unprocessed wood, branches, trees and limbs, weeds, and garden waste. These materials should be placed on the existing pile. Processed lumber (lumber from the store) including; all construction waste, cardboard, paper, tires, plastics, and other garbage are not allowed in the burn area. You can check out a

key from the City Office to access the burn area. Many people have asked why this area remains locked. When the area is open people tend to start dumping unauthorized garbage at the site. It is a privilege to have this service available and if it is abused the County will stop us from having this service.



To the Rescue

The Enterprise Fire Department is proud to announce the completion of their new Pierce Responder Fire Engine. The engine, largely paid for by a grant, just left the final production line and is undergoing some final pump testing. We expect to have the engine delivered to us some time towards the latter part of June.



Mosquito abatement

The City of Enterprise is looking for someone willing to serve on the Southwest Mosquito Abatement and Control Board. If this is something you are interested in doing, please contact us at (435) 878-2221 or come in to the offices for more information.

The southwest Mosquito Abatement and Control District has listed many ways to help protect you and your home from mosquitos:

Turn over or remove containers in your yard where water collects such as old tires, plant trays, buckets, and toys. Clean out birdbaths and wading pools at least once a week, and remove

standing water on tarps or flat roofs. Clean clogged rain gutters and downspouts. Clean and stock garden ponds with mosquito-eating fish or mosquito dunks. Recycle old bottles and cans. Repair leaky faucets and sprinklers. Keep swimming pools clean or drain them. Repair door and window screens if torn. Keep weeds and tall grass cut short; adult mosquitoes look for these shady places to rest during the



hot daylight hours. Get rid of mosquito breeding sites. (Electric "bug zappers" do not help since they usually attract more mosquitoes than they kill.) Keep window screens on campers, tents, and boats "bug-tight".

Why should you wear repellent with DEET? It is the most effective insect repellent available. It helps people reduce their exposure to mosquito bites that carry viruses such as West Nile virus. How does mosquito repellent work? Mosquitoes are attracted to people by skin odor and carbon dioxide from breath. DEET does not actually kill mosquitoes, it just makes them unable to detect us.
