Fire Hazards

With the extremely wet weather that we have experienced this spring, the weeds seem to be thriving! Some lots have weeds as tall as the fences. They may be green now, but not for long. Soon they will dry out and become a dangerous fire hazard. With our regular hot and dry conditions, there is

always a high threat of fire. For your safety as well as your neighbors, please eliminate areas of all excess weeds and rye grass growth around fences, barns, buildings or any open area. The City would like to see improvements made so we don't have to issue citations. If the fire department

responds to a fire due to property neglect, all fire suppression and associated costs will be billed to the property owner. With the cooperation of property owners, this risk can be greatly reduced.

Swimming Pool Laws

With the weather warming up and the kids out of school, lots of people are setting up pools. There are State laws designed to help keep our children safe. When pools are installed they must be secured by means of a barrier that complies with the following:

- **305.5** Onground residential pool structure as a barrier. An onground residential pool wall structure or a barrier mounted on top of an onground residential pool wall structure shall serve as a barrier where all of the following conditions are present:
- 1. Where only the pool wall serves as the barrier, the bottom of the wall is on grade, the top of the wall is not less than 48 inches (1219 mm) above grade for the entire perimeter of the pool, the wall

complies with the requirements of Section 305.2 and the pool manufacturer allows the wall to serve as a barrier.

- 2. Where a barrier is mounted on top of the pool wall, the top of the barrier is not less than 48 inches (1219 mm) above grade for the entire perimeter of the pool, and the wall and the barrier on top of the wall comply with the requirements of Section 305.2.
- 3. Ladders or steps used as means of access to the pool are Capable of being

secured, locked or removed to prevent access except where the ladder or steps are surrounded by a barrier that meets the requirements of Section 305.

- **4.** Openings created by the securing, locking or removal of ladders and steps do not allow the passage of a 4-Inch (102 mm) diameter sphere.
- **5.** Barriers that are mounted on top of onground residential pool walls are installed in accordance with the pool manufacturer's instructions requirements.

Please follow the above State laws as citations will be issued to those who do not. More importantly, we want to keep our children safe and avoid any unwanted tragedies.
