Burn Permits

Open Burn continues until May 30th. You can get a burn permit by completing the State Burn Permit Application at air.utah.gov/OpenBurning/ form/index.php. You can check to see if it is a good day to burn after you select the City. Also, you will find a link to this website under the public safety tab on our City web page at Enterpriseutah.org. Once you complete the application, a notification will be sent to the City Fire Chief so you do not need to call the City or contact the Fire Chief in order to burn.

Community Park Update
