## Spring Clean Up

## Burn Permits

Open Burn continues until May 30<sup>th</sup>. You can get a burn permit by completing the State Burn Permit Application at [air.utah.gov/OpenBurning/form/index.php](http://air.utah.gov/OpenBurning/form/index.php). You can check to see if it is a good day to burn after you select the City. Also, you will find a link to this website under the public safety tab on our City web page at [Enterpriseutah.org](http://Enterpriseutah.org). Once you complete the application, a notification will be sent to the City Fire Chief so you do not need to call the City or contact the Fire Chief in order to burn.

## Dumpsite Upgrade

The City of Enterprise and Washington County Solid Waste are working together and sharing the cost to make improvements at the City's dump site. A contractor recently installed a cement pad and wall on the north side of the site. A large roll off dumpster will be placed in this area. This dumpster should be used for large items that can't fit into the

smaller existing dumpsters. Adding this large dumpster should help increase the capacity of what the smaller dumpsters can hold when the large items are not placed in them. The burn area will remain the same. This area is for natural vegetation and branches. Processed wood should not be placed in this area. As the gate to the burn area has

been down for the upgrade, pallets and processed lumber have been placed in the burn pile. It is a privilege to have this service available for our Community and the County will stop us from having this service if it continues to be abused.

### Speed Limit Changes

Watch for lights and sirens as you drive on West Main Street and North Center Street. The speed limits have been changed and you may catch yourself with a ticket if you continue to drive at the speed you are used to. The speed limit on West Main is now 35 mph and on North Center it is now 25 mph.
