## Fall Clean Up

Be sure when you are out and about to drive past the new City Park! It is coming along quite nicely! The framing of the Community Center is complete and the roof will be installed shortly. Exterior options are being explored for the building and we hope to have it winterized before the snow flies!

The tennis courts are all but done. The surface coating will be applied next spring.

The sports court building is on-site and ready to be put together. There has been quite a bit of misunderstanding about this portion of the park. It will be an enclosed building so it can be



utilized throughout the entire year.

The pavilion pads have been poured and hopefully we are able to get those up before snowfall as well. Construction will continue along as weather allows. It is exciting to see this park become a reality!

One item of concern is the survey stakes have been disappearing. It is very costly to have someone come and re-survey to put new stakes in the ground. Please speak to your children about this and ask for their help in this matter. Thank you!
