Road Chip and Seal Project

The Road Chip and Seal Project is finished for this year. Before the chip and seal was put on, the roads were patched and 625 East was widened. The City is planning to complete the roads that were not done this year, next year. We are asking residents to help prevent dirt from being pushed over the asphalt on the shoulder of the road. The dirt can cause water buildup, freezing, and cracking of the asphalt.



Burn Permits

Open Burn began on September 15th and will continue until November 15th. You can get a burn permit by completing the State Burn Permit Application at air.utah.gov/OpenBurning/form/index.php. Elections

Voting for the upcoming election will be done by **MAIL ONLY**. There will **NOT** be a polling location in the City of Enterprise.

The Washington County Clerk's Office has made a change to how registered voters will be casting their ballots in all future county elections. Washington County will be conducting its elections mainly by Mail. Starting with the upcoming November 6, 2018 election, eligible registered voters will be receiving their ballots in the mail. In addition,

Washington County will have 6 to 7 Vote Centers available on Election Day to assist voters from 7am to 8pm. Each vote center will offer accommodations for voters who have motor or visual difficulties.

Completed ballots returned by mail require a First-Class stamp and must be postmarked no later than the Monday before Election Day. You may also drop your voted ballot by a Vote Center Location on Election Day. Additionally, Washington County will also be

providing 5 Ballot Drop Box Locations which are open 24 hours a day until 8pm on Election Day. Ballots returned via drop boxes do NOT require postage.

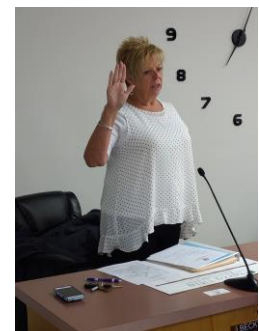

Speed Limit Signs Moving

Has anyone noticed that the City's Dump-Site isn't quite as messy these days? Doesn't everyone wish that the garbage would pick itself up? Since that will only happen in our dreams, we have Ron and Jeri Lehm to thank for making it a reality. The City would like to thank all of those that help by cleaning up after themselves. With everyone doing their part it will continue to keep the Dump-Site cleaner and make Enterprise a little more beautiful. It has now been two months that there has

been an additional roll-off dumpster at the site and the regular dumpsters have been dumped an extra time each week. All of the dumpsters continue to be full at the time of emptying. The City continues to look into more ways to resolve this issue. Please remember that any natural tree branches, weeds, and garden waste can be placed in the burn area. A key can be obtained at the City Offices during regular business hours, **or at Brackens (even on weekends)**. Bulky items

should be left curbside and make a call to Republic Services to notify them of the items to be picked up. They can be reached at (435) 628-2821 or (800) 438-5927. By placing these items in the correct places it will help free up some space in the dumpsters at the Dump-Site. The new high definition cameras have been installed and are being monitored for illegal dumping and scavenging. Citations are and will be given to those breaking the Dump-Site rules.

Take Pride in Keeping Our Community Clean

What more can be said about the Dump-Site located on 100 North? It is always a mess! Please, please, please help keep our Community cleaner by doing your part.

When the dumpsters are full, wait for them to be emptied before leaving your trash. When garbage is piled on top, and the good ole Enterprise wind blows, it is a recipe for a disastrous mess! Containing your trash would be helpful. Instead of placing loose garbage and paper in the bins, put it in garbage bags

to keep it from blowing away. Republic Services is emptying the dumpsters 3 times per week to help with this problem. Posted at the Dump-Site are rules for what can be placed in the dumpsters. Be familiar with them so you don't find yourself with a citation for not obeying the rules.

Furniture and appliances should not be placed in the dumpsters, or at the Dump-Site. Large items should be placed curbside. **Please call the City Office to schedule a pick-up.** These items are picked up

on Mondays. Please let the City know if your item does not get picked up.

Don't forget the Tree/Limb burn area just north of the Dump-Site. This is for tree branches, weeds, and garden waste, including cut grass. This area is for natural, unprocessed wood only and no other garbage is allowed in the burn area. You can check out a key at the City Office and can keep it over the weekend if needed. Please help out by placing garbage in the correct location.

The Washington County School Board had its annual work meeting with the City. Topics of discussion were the New

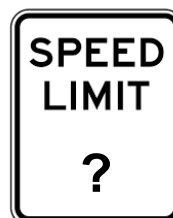
Park, the upcoming bond, and what kind of growth we expect here in Enterprise. The School Board donated money to help cover the
