DUMP-SITE

The Trash Collection Site located on 100 N has been the source of much concern lately. The overflowing dumpsters and the resulting mess have been a nuisance for quite some time.

Republic Services will start emptying the dumpsters 3 times a week to help with the overflowing trash bins. We are also asking residents to follow the posted dump site rules more closely. New security cameras are being installed at the site, and citations will be made for those breaking the rules.

Tree limbs belong in the burn pile. A key to the gate can be obtained at the City Office during regular business hours or at Brackens on the weekends.

Construction materials should be placed in a dumpster on the work site.

Furniture and appliances should not be placed in the dumpsters. Large items should be placed curbside, then **call the City Office at 878-2221 or Republic Services at (435) 628-2821 to schedule pick-up.** These items will be picked up on Mondays. If they are not picked up, please contact the City Office so we can let Republic Services know.

Thank you for your help in trying to keep the dump site cleaner for the Community.

Animal Control, or Lack Thereof!

It seems as though many members of the community are becoming very lax in abiding by the law when it comes to their pets. Here are a few reminders of the law.

It is unlawful to let any animal run at large regardless if it is causing problems. It is unlawful for the owner or custodian of any dog to allow the dog to attack, chase, or worry any person, any domestic animal having a commercial value, or any domestic fowl. It is also unlawful for the owner or custodian of an animal to permit the animal to defecate upon a public street, sidewalk, park, or other area, or upon the property of another. All dogs should be licensed within 30 days of turning 4 months and every year after. There should not be more than 2 dogs at any

home unless the occupant has a kennel license.

Animal Control is enforced by signed complaints. If there is an animal that is running loose, being a nuisance, destroying your property, or killing your chickens, please come in to the City Office and fill out a complaint form. There needs to be a paper trail proving that a dog has done something in order for action to be taken. Posting on Facebook or griping about it, is not going to solve your problem. When you see something, if possible take a picture of the animal and notify the City Office and if you want to file a complaint please do so. Many ask why file a complaint when nothing is done about it? Depending on the offense, the owner of the animal will receive a warning and then if the same animal continues to

be a problem, they will be ticketed by our Animal Control Officer or through Washington County Sheriff's Office. After the owner has 3 violations in a 12 month period, the dog will be impounded and the owner will not be able to redeem their dog.

Please be a responsible pet owner because not everybody loves your pet as much as you do!

City Vehicle Leasing Program

In an effort to save money, the Enterprise City Council has recently adopted a new vehicle program. Under this new program, work trucks will be rented instead of purchased outright. The program allows the City to continue to take advantage of the state contract pricing, but the trucks are then returned

and sold on the private market. The City pays a greatly reduced rental rate and the trucks are always under warranty. This program has been used with several other government entities, including Washington County, and they all report significant savings. We hope that this program

will save money and improve reliability. Another perk is that the trucks can be "reserved" by members of the community, and then purchased after a year of use. If you have questions or would like to discuss the particulars about purchasing the trucks, please contact the City Office.

Park Progress

If you have driven past the new City Park you have seen the amazing amount of progress that has been accomplished. Isn't it exciting? The groundwork has been done, cement for the west walkways has been poured, the storm drains are finished, and the Community Center is well underway. Construction of the sports court, tennis courts, and the splash pad will begin soon. There has been an overwhelming amount of people that have come out to volunteer their time in helping with the construction! What

wonderful people we have living here in Enterprise. Many of the volunteers have been the youth! We have some great kids in the community that are willing to help where and whenever needed.

In an effort to fund the park and continue construction, the City has applied for a number of grants. We were successful in obtaining a

grant for \$50,000.00 from the George S. & Delores Dore Eccles foundation. The City was also presented with a check for \$200,000.00 from the Washington County Commission.

OHV/ATV Complaints

We have had quite a few complaints of people and mostly children driving ATVs recklessly through town. Ordinances for OHV, and ATV use will be enforced. Here are some reminders on to keep you out of trouble.

You may not operate an OHV or ATV on any road unless the operator has a valid motor vehicle license. If you are under 18 without a license you need to carry on hand the appropriate safety certificate **AND** be under the **DIRECT SUPERVISION** of an adult. Direct Supervision means oversight at a distance of no more than 300 feet. Visual contact must be maintained so that advice and assistance can be given and received by the operator. Helmets are required for anyone 18 and under. OHV/ATVs can be driven on city streets following all traffic laws during the hours of 5:00 AM – 10:00 PM, except for Main Street and SR-18. Main Street and SR-18 can only be crossed to get to another City street.

Introducing Officer Graham

We want to welcome our new School Resource officer, Deputy Graham Hancock. Deputy Hancock was raised in Florida until he was moved to Southern Utah while in middle school. He completed his high school education and then soon moved back to Florida.
