REVERSE 911 CALLS

Last year with the Flatt Fire and subsequent flooding, residents received reverse 911 calls for evacuations and even the need for people to fill sand bags. Washington county uses a notification system called Everbridge for their citizen alert system. Everbridge enables the cities within Washington Coun-

ty, Utah to provide it's residents with critical information quickly in a variety of situations, such as unexpected road closures, missing persons, and evacuations of buildings or neighborhoods. You can sign up for this system by going to https://member.everbridge.net and creating an account. You

can choose which method you receive these time sensitive messages, such as your home, cell, or business phone, email, text message, hearing impaired devices, and more. Individuals with disabilities who need assistance can register by calling Washington County Citizen Alert at 435-627-4914.

FIRE RESTRICTIONS FOR THE AREA

With the beautiful summer weather moving in, a lot of residents will start camping in their spare time. You may be wondering if you can have a camp fire while you enjoy the outdoors.

According to the US Forest Service website, because of the increasing potential for human caused wildfire activity, dry conditions, and high fire danger in Southwest Utah, Color Country Interagency Fire Managers are implementing fire restrictions beginning Friday, June 1st at 12:01am. The following acts

are prohibited until further notice:

Igniting, building, maintaining, or using a fire, including charcoal and briquettes, outside a fire structure provided by the agency within a designated area is prohibited. All debris burning is strictly prohibited.

Campfires are allowed in all developed recreation sites. campgrounds, picnic areas, and home sites that are maintained and administered by the agency, or home sites where running water is present are allowed. Stoves or grills that are fueled solely by liquid petroleum fuels are also allowed.

Lands are becoming increasingly dry and fire danger is increasing daily. Please ensure your campfire is completely out before you leave and all ignition sources are a safe distance away from vegetation to mitigate unwanted wildfires.

Enterprise City is a rural farming community located in Southwest Utah. The area raises some of the best hay, corn and kids. With several nearby lakes, boating and fishing opportunities are easy to find. Enterprise is the kind of place you like to call home and also like to come home to. The mountains also invite with their scenic beauty, atv and hiking trails, as well as some great hunting. At the end of August, Enterprise City hosts it's annual "Corn Fest", where the whole town turns out to celebrate small town life and the bounty that our local farmers produce.

Pioneer Settlers entered the area in the late 1800's and settled a few miles West of present day Hebron. Those industrious pioneers had a grand plan to build a large dam to help store a sizable amount of water for irrigating their crops during the dry summer season. This allowed them to irrigate far more land and to move farming into the broad valley East of Hebron. Soon a new townsite was plotted and most Hebron residents moved to present day Enterprise.

For the past 7 years we all have been able to enjoy an awesome firework show to end our day on the 4th of July. In the past, the 4th of July committee has relied on donations from local businesses to fund these fireworks for our entertainment. DROUGHT UPDATE AND WATER SAVING OPPORTUNITIES

99.45% of the state is in severe drought or worse, with 43.46% in extreme drought. Governer Cox has issued a drought emergency order.

Statewide snow water equivalent (SWE), or how much water would be in the snow-pack if it melted, peaked at 12 inches. This is 75% of the typical median peak of 16 inches for our water year. Overall statewide storage is 60% of capacity. This time last year, reservoirs were about 67% of capacity.

Water Saving Opportunities

Take a shorter shower, update appliances, fix a leak, adjust sprinkler timers, install waterwise landscaping.

Old toilets are the leading cause of water wasted in Utah homes. At https:// utahwatersavers.com/ Program/4/toilet#programoverview you can apply for an up to \$100 toilet replacement rebate when you replace your old toilet with a Watersense-labeled toilet.

Toilets use more water than any other indoor fixture. Because toilets manufactured before 1994 use more gallons of water per flush, replacing them is an easy way to conserve water.

Garden Water Conservation Tips

- Plant your garden when temperatures are cooler and plants require less water. (This is also less stressful for the plants)
- Arrange plants in your garden according to watering needs and consider your sprinkler zones.
- Install a drip system instead of row watering.

- Use a thick layer of mulch around landscape plants and on bare soil surfaces. (This reduces evaporation, promotes plant growth and reduces weeds.)
- Remove weeds from the garden (This helps cut down on excess water consumption due to plant competition.)
- Spot water to green up dry spots.
- Plants don't drink as much water as you think! Learn how much water they need and how best to apply just the right amount.
- Collect the runoff from your roof in a barrel.

Register for rainwater harvesting free with the Division of Water Rights before harvesting rainwater. You can collect and store rainwater without registering in no more than 2 covered containers if neither container stores more than 100 gallons
