Pioneer Day is a Utah holiday that celebrates the migration of the Pioneers of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints to the Salt Lake Valley. Each year there are fun activities in Enterprise for the entire family.

The day started off with the early morning Fun Run which included a 5k and a 10k run.

There was also a community breakfast. Perhaps the event most anticipated is the Pioneer Day Parade. This year there were multiple wonderful floats representing local businesses, first responders, church groups and more.

SCHOOL PICKUP/DROP-OFF

The first day of school for Enterprise Elementary is August 11. Please be aware of school zones and crosswalks as you drive on the streets around town. Follow these simple suggestions to help ensure all of our children arrive at school and home safely.

1. Make sure to drive slowly, especially in the school block on 100 E.
2. Stop at crosswalks. Make sure they are all

clear before proceeding.

3. Be aware of your surroundings. Often times, kids will run across the street from behind a car and they can easily be missed if the timing is off.
4. Teach your kids street safety. We are all trying our best to teach our children how to navigate the world safely. It's worth the time to make

sure that they look both ways before crossing the road, and to avoid running from between cars. It's also a good idea to teach them not to ride their bikes between and in front of cars.

WILDLAND FIRE CREW

Northwest Washington County has been and is still considered to be one of the largest concerns for wildland fires in the state of Utah. The area is mainly brush, Pinion Pines and Juniper trees, which are all considered extremely flammable during the dry hot early summer to late fall months. In the hundreds of thousands of acres of land in this area there are pockets of residential communities scattered in the interface area. Those communities are a mixture of homes and ranches. The homes and outbuildings are often found to be at great risk due to their proximity to the chaparral. The area of northwest Washington County has had

a long history of wildland fires throughout the years. In early times the majority of fires were caused by natural occurrences such as lightning. Over time, as the area has become more populated, we have seen a change in the causes of wildland fires. With more use of the public lands the frequency of fires has increased, and we have seen more fires that were/are human caused. The size of the fires in this area range from single tree fires to fires that cover thousands of acres and burn structures as well as the chaparral. The amount and value of property lost to wildland fires seems to be on the increase. With the ongoing hot dry spells we

are experiencing we are seeing fire behavior that is a hotter – faster burning fire.

The Enterprise Wildland Fire Crew got an early start this year, with their first deployment to the Calf Canyon Fire in New Mexico on May 17th. Last year, the first deployment for the crew was July 23rd. When our crew is deployed outside of our area, The City of Enterprise is paid for the use of our crew and equipment. This income is used to pay for this equipment, payroll and the remainder is used for Emergency Services which is a large part of our budget. We also have a team of volunteer reserve Wildland Firefighters that

stay in the area in case of wildland fires on our home turf. The City of Enterprise Wildland Fire Crew runs under the direction of Deputy Chief Jeff Germain.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS- COMMUNICATION AND MAKING A PLAN FOR YOUR SCHOOL AGED CHILDREN

Communication

Creating a Family Emergency Communication Plan is essential during a disaster in order to send and receive information from your family. Communication networks, such as mobile phones and computers, could be unreliable during disasters, and electricity could be disrupted. Planning in advance will help ensure that all the members of your household—including children and people with disabilities and others with access and functional needs, as well as outside caregivers—know how to reach each other and where to meet up in an emergency:

1. Collect and share information. Create a paper copy of the contact information for your family and other important people. Ensure you have an out-of-town contact for everyone in your household to call. When local phone lines are overcrowded, long distance lines might be easier to get through.
2. Practice your plan. Have regular household meetings to review and practice your plan. Make sure your out-of-town contact agrees and knows what to expect in the event of an emergency.
3. Texting is best. When communicating with a mobile phone, a text message may get through when a phone call will not.

Make A Plan For School-aged Children

What if disaster hits when your children are in school?

Make a plan that includes meeting places, safety words or codes, and emergency contact information. Keep a copy in the child's backpack. Build a school disaster kit to fit in a

desk or backpack that can offer the extra comfort your child may need until he/she can be reunited with you.

SLOW THE FLOW-FREE WATER CHECK

What is a Water Check?

A Water Check analyzes the efficiency of your automatic sprinkler irrigation system. Trained evaluators come to your home, business, or institution, perform a Water Check, and provide you with a customized irrigation schedule.

Soil type, grass root depth, water pressure, sprinkler efficiency and precipitation rates are also determined. The entire process

takes from 1 to 1.5 hours depending on the size of the property.

What is a Landscape Consultation?

During a landscape consultation trained technicians will help you find ways to improve the efficiency of your irrigation and landscape. Whether you are looking for design ideas, watering suggestions, sprinkler system

The Enterprise Cornfest will be celebrating 32 years this year! The 2022 Cornfest will be held on August 27th from 10:00am-4:00pm at the Enterprise City Park. (400 E. 400 S.) An estimated 4,000-5,000 people attend this event each year.

Some of the events include the annual Car Show, the softball, baseball, volleyball, and cornhole tournaments, booths for shopping, live entertainment and the Dutch Oven Dinner, that used to be a fundraiser for Enterprise Elementary, however they will not be able to run the dinner this year. Enterprise City is a rural farming community located in Southwest Utah. The area raises some of the best hay, corn and kids. With several nearby lakes, boating and fishing opportunities are easy to find. Enterprise is the kind of place you like to call home and also like to come home to. At the end of August, Enterprise City hosts it's annual "Corn Fest", where the whole town turns out to celebrate small town life and the bounty that our local farmers produce.

Pioneer Settlers entered the area in the late 1800's and settled a few miles West of present day Hebron. Those industrious pioneers had a grand plan to build a large dam to help store a sizable amount of water for irrigating their crops during the dry summer season. This allowed them to irrigate far more land and to move farming into the broad valley East of Hebron. Soon a new townsite was plotted and most Hebron residents moved to present day Enterprise.
