express that this open house is purely informational to get to know the volunteers and be acquainted with what they do. You are not committing to anything by checking it all out.

In addition, Enterprise Fire and EMS will be starting an EMT class on August 31st, 2023 that will go through January 11, 2024. The class is free to those who commit to volunteering on Enterprise's ambulance for two

PRIMARY ELECTION CANCELLED

In the race for the office of three (3) City Council Members, a primary election is no longer required after one candidate withdrew. All six (6) of the remaining candidates will move on to the November election, and for this reason, you do not need to cast your vote in the City Council Primary Election.

REGISTERED REPUBLICAN VOTERS: You will receive a ballot in the mail after August 15, 2023. A portion of the ballot is for the **Special Republican Primary for the U.S. House Utah Dist. 2.**

Please cast your vote for one of the three (3) Republican candidates listed. The ballot will also still have the Enterprise Municipal Primary Election Information printed on it. It will still show seven (7) candidates. You do not need to cast your vote on that portion of the ballot. Your ballot must be postmarked or dropped in the ballot box in the City Office by September 5, 2023.

Enterprise City is a rural farming community located in Southwest Utah. The area raises some of the best hay, corn and kids. With several nearby lakes, boating and fishing opportunities are easy to find. Enterprise is the kind of place you like to call home and also like to come home to. The mountains also invite with their scenic beauty, atv and hiking trails, as well as some great hunting. At the end of August, Enterprise City hosts it's annual "Corn Fest", where the whole town turns out to celebrate small town life and the bounty that our local farmers produce.

Pioneer Settlers entered the area in the late 1800's and settled a few miles West of present day Hebron. Those industrious pioneers had a grand plan to build a large dam to help store a sizable amount of water for irrigating their crops during the dry summer season. This allowed them to irrigate far more land and to move farming into the broad valley East of Hebron. Soon a new townsite was plotted and most Hebron residents moved to present day Enterprise.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS-GRILL SAFETY

Grilling season is here, and we would like to remind the community to be safe this summer. Here are some tips and habits that can help prevent accidental fires during summer barbecues:

- Make sure to open a gas grill before lighting it.
- Clean grills after each use to remove grease. Place all grill coals in a metal trash can with a lid after they've

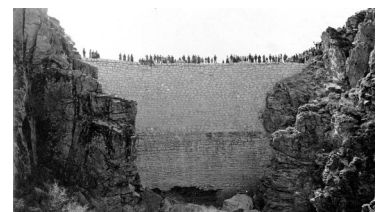
cooled down.

- Move the grill away from siding, decking, and other things that can catch fire.
- Watch the flames. Never leave any grills, fire pits or patio torches unattended.
- Use long-handled barbecue tools when cooking on the grill.
- Keep your grill clean and keep children and pets away from the

grill area.

- Turn off or put out fires before you leave the backyard. Following these rules when using a grill will help ensure your outdoor time is safe and fun.
