CONGRATULATIONS EMT GRADUATES

Enterprise EMS hosted an EMS open house in July of last year. There was a great turnout, and many guests were recruited to take this year's EMT class.

This EMT class was a very dedicated group. 9 of the 16 participants have already gone on to pass their national exam and are certified EMTs, with the others having their exam scheduled.

To pass this EMT class, participants must put in 120 hours of class time, ride-a longs on the ambulance and practice skills. They must also pass 6 exams in the class, as well as the national skills exam in order to graduate.

There has been a long time request for playground equipment at the city park that is age appropriate for younger children.


This new equipment is now installed and available for younger children to play on.

Those industrious pioneers had a grand plan to build a large dam to help store a sizable amount of water for irrigating their crops during the dry summer season. This allowed them to irrigate far more land and to move farming into the broad valley East of Hebron. Soon a new townsite was plotted and most Hebron residents moved to present day Enterprise.
